

A Resolution of the Elko County Republican Party Urging the Responsible Agencies to Meet the Legal Mandates of the Wild and Free Roaming Horses and Burros Act of 1971

WHEREAS, the population of wild horses in Elko County and other parts of our great state and nation have grown far beyond a level compatible with thriving ecological balance, and

WHEREAS, the extensive horse population growth has severely impacted and caused the deaths of other wildlife in Nevada, eg, by destroying native wildlife environments, scarce water sources and direct competition with other wild animal species, and

WHEREAS, the negative economic impact of wild horse population growth in Nevada is severe

THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED that the Elko County Republican Party strongly urges the agencies responsible for management of wild horse populations to meet their mandate legally required by the Wild and Free Roaming Horses and Burros Act of 1971 to achieve real "Thriving Ecological Balance" in the horse herds in Nevada.
