



A Resolution of the Elko County Republican Party Urging Replacement of Dominion Voting Machines, Investigation of Alternative Voting Methods, and Opposing the System of Universal Mail-in Ballots

Whereas integrity of the voting process, vote counting, and vote reporting are essential to the survival of our democratic republic or any form of democracy; and

Whereas the people's trust in the integrity of those processes is equally essential; and

Whereas there is evidence of vote count tampering in places where Dominion voting machines have been used, especially in metropolitan areas in swing states; and

Whereas alternative technologies and voting methods are available; and

Whereas our republic is based on the principles of each citizen having one vote and only citizens having the right to vote; and

Whereas in 2020 the Nevada Legislature, in a special session and under the guise of a supposed state of emergency attributed to COVID-19, enacted a universal mail-in ballot system wherein actual ballots are mailed to all active voters whether requested or not; and

Whereas in 2021 the Nevada Legislature in regular session made the universal mail-in ballot system permanent; and

Whereas there is no effective way for the County Clerks or Registrars of Voters to accurately track the residence of voters who move; and

Whereas consequently many ballots are undeliverable or are forwarded inappropriately with the resulting loss of ballot security as evidenced by stacks of undelivered unsecured ballots in a significant number of locations; and

Whereas it is undeniable that some vote fraud has taken place; and

Whereas these issues raise concerns about voting integrity, undermine the trust of our citizenry and call into question the legitimacy of some election outcomes;



NOW THEREFORE BE IT RESOLVED, that the Elko County Republican Party:

- 1. states its opposition to the widespread use of Dominion voting machines throughout the United States;**
- 2. strongly urges the Elko County Board of Commissioners and the Elko County Clerk to investigate alternatives to the Dominion voting machines currently in use in Elko County and to cancel the contract with Dominion if necessary;**
- 3. Reject the adoption of any other electronic voting system;**
- 4. recognizes that such alternatives could include paper ballots, optical ballot readers, and any other sandboxed (internet isolated) systems that would increase security and reliability;**
- 5. recognizes that implementation of alternatives would have associated costs, but asserts that election integrity is worth finding the necessary funding;**
- 6. states its strongest opposition to the current universal mail-in ballot system in Nevada and urges our local government representatives to make positions known to our Legislature and Governor;**
- 7. urges the repeal in full of AB 321;**
- 8. opposes same day voter registration;**
- 9. supports requiring valid state-issued picture ID both for voter registration and issuance of a ballot at the place of polling.**
